<p>When we were at the Appleton, I asked about recycling and I was told "no, we do not recycle." There were lots of soda cans and plastic bottles in the garbage.</p>
<p>Can recycling bins be placed on 2nd floor in C-2 or C-3? In 202-A there are separate light switches to utilize more or less lighting as needed. Is there any way to install such selective lighting controls in 202-B?</p>
<p>Go Green CF!!</p>
<p>class rooms should be tiled instead of using rugs. Rugs accumulate dirt and require more upkeep.</p>

<p>I am making printable Adobe forms of two or more page print duplex in formatting in Adobe</p>
<p>I cannot control lighting as there are no windows, and it is a "pod" area. Lack of recycling in PDC where many courses take place with plastic and aluminum drink cans tossed in the garbage!</p>

<p>In the Assessment Center, we use paper recycled from other departments that has printing on only one side as scratch paper for all our tests. After it is used for scratch paper, we put it in the recycling bin.</p>
<p>In our yearly convocations, etc. I really don't see recycling containers all the time when there are numerous bottles & cans disposed of. Maybe our faculty office can have a supply of used & cut up papers for short quizzes instead of throwing away papers that were printed with mistakes (EXCEPT test papers, of course). And maybe we (faculty can also help recycle papers if we have sharp paper cutters in our office.</p>
<p>I have 6 fluroscent double bulb recessed lighting fixtures in my office---perhaps I could do with fewer lit bulbs. I have a</p>

How do we get recycle bins for our building? I would love to have them right here in our kitchen area for students and staff to use.
I am currently using a home office.
Recycling at the Levy Center has been aluminum cans only. I commit to finding good spots for containers for other recyclable materials and to encourage use.
Can we get a sign for a department? The Library reference and circulation departments as well as the LSC labs employ sustainability strategies as a group and we can proudly post the sign(s) where students would see it. Or in the true spirit of sustainability could we get a sign for the building as a whole?
Student essays in my class are sent, checked, & returned online.
I also save old papers and re-use them to print on the back side for items that are for my own use but do not get mailed out. I also use old papers for scrap papers to write things down like a to do list.
We use paper we have from old files delete any personal information and use these for notes and scrap paper given to students testing.
ie: Purchasing items containing recycled content is not always economical.
Some items not checked because they are not applicable. I have no windows in my office & do not use charging devices.
Please install more recycling bins for plastic bottles throughout the campus. It is noted that there is minimal effort to segregate aluminum cans, plastic bottles and paper waste from regular trash.
